It had been hoped that the Membership List would be Number 6 of this year's issues of the NEWS. For various reasons this has proven infeasible. Among these reasons are: The recent illness of Dr. Ehrlich, Society Secretary, to whom falls the major part of the list preparation; reorganizational plans moving forward at Stanford University, with resulting reduction in secretarial time available to preparation of the List; numerous recent changes in addresses of members necessitating recutting of certain portions of the stencil for the List.

The Membership List has been promised as a Christmas present, to be Number 8, the final issue for this year.

These changes in plans, coming as they do, have caused a delay in the production of Number 6. The Editor hopes the membership will understand the delay.

The Annual Meeting of the Society in Santa Barbara, Calif. was very well attended, and a number of members came from distant areas. The papers were well received. The minutes will appear in a forthcoming issue of the JOURNAL.

Members are reminded that the Annual Meeting for 1963 will be held in San Antonio, Texas.

With time drawing near for Contributors to the Season's Summary to submit their contributions to Area Coordinators, this "trial balloon" is offered: At the Annual Meeting the possibility of a form for reporting the Summary was discussed. Mention was made of a form devised by Fred Thorne and used by certain selected contributors in the Southwest in 1961, with apparently good results. A motion was made and carried that a copy of this form be sent to each of the members along with the Number 6 issue of the NEWS, to get their reaction. This form may be used for reporting in 1962. It is urged that members use this form unless they have great personal feelings against so doing. The more members participating, the more surely we will learn whether or not the form has value. If the results justify such action, this or a similar form might be used each year. The value of form reporting should be uniformity, a quality the lack of which in the Summary has been criticized. An attempt has been made to express on the form various factors affecting numbers of Lepidoptera, in addition to records of occurrence. If used, the form should provide an interesting variation to our present reporting practices.

Suggested date for returning forms to your Area Coordinator is January 15, 1963.

Duncan Hyslop of St. Clair, Michigan, reports finding living ova of Pieris rapae and of Speyeria atlantis in envelopes of recently papered specimens. The ova of S. atlantis were saved, hatched, and reared on Viola. See a previous NEWS for note on finding of living ova of a saturniid from a recently killed female adult.
