<u>NEWS ITEM--My</u> friend, Katherine H. Karsner, whose charming butterfly poem appeared in the Lepidopterists' Journal (vol. 17, no. 4, p. 242) thinks our members might be interested in the following personal experience:

In August, 1938, we spent several weeks at Vulpera, Lower Engadine, Grisons, Switzerland, altitude about 4,000 feet. One morning I was sitting on a bench in the forest, playing some soft baroque music on my faithful recorder, when to my amazement and delight quite a number of butterflies came to rest on the flute and even on my moving fingers. I continued to play for a short while. When I stopped, --it was time to go back to the hotel, --they flew away, leaving me with the unforgettable memory of the fairy touch of butterfly wings on my hands. I regret I cannot name the species. The color was similar to the monarch, but they were of smaller size, possibly a species of <u>Vanessa</u>, in German called "Grosser Fuchs."
