THE SEASON'S SUMMARY

6. Is the Summary worthwhile? Yes, 57; No, 8; only for butterflies and large moths, 1, Doubtful, 3.
7. Would you prefer a prompt report (15 April) or a later one that might be more accurate? Prompt, 31; Later, 25; Don't care, 2.
8. Or would you prefer no report at all? Yes, 4; No, 33.
9. What improvements would you suggest?
 - a. None, 10.
 - b. Expanded report, 15.
 - c. Miscellaneous, 24.
10. Would you like to have volume numbers for the NEWS: Yes, 29; No, 8; Don't care, 27.
