NEWS NOTES

Dr. Tarsicio Escalante, Av. Cuitlahac 63, Tacuba 17, Mexico D. F., reports receiving last August from Vera Cruz State a specimen of Anteos maerula F., taken in July. This specimen, a female, has a perfect round hole near the black spot on the left fore wing. Could this be a specimen that someone had marked for some reason?

Mr. Thomas Bowen, Jr., Folcroft, Pa., reports that he finds "Revell Cement (airplane glue) for Styrene Plastic" to be very effective for gluing on antennae, and it might work for repairing wings, also.

Julian P. Donahue, Mich. State Univ., East Lansing, Mich., refers to Mr. Bryant Mather's suggestion for shipping Lepidoptera in 15 July 1965 NEWS. He suggests that, in addition to seating the pins firmly in the box, a piece of heavy blotting paper or thin cardboard, cut so it will just fit inside the box, be placed on top of the pins. Then a resilient material, such as cotton, is placed on top of this sheet so that when the lid is put on it will exert slight pressure on the pins. This will make it impossible for the pins to work loose. A piece of masking tape, attached to one end of the cardboard, and doubled over, makes a convenient handle for use in removing it.

Your Editor has been using a cellulose material as packing between the inner and outer boxes when shipping Lepidoptera. This material comes in various forms, usually in 8 or 10 thin layers with or without a paper backing. It is used in large sheets for wrapping office and household furniture by the manufacturers and can probably be obtained for little or nothing from furniture dealers. The technical name of this material is not known, but it probably has various trade names.
