## CANADIAN REQUIREMENTS COVERING IMPORTATION OF LIVING LEPIDOPTERA ....

- 1. Importations permitted only if for scientific or educational use.
- Application for permit is made to Director, Plant Protection Division, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, CANADA, stating scientific name of insect or insects, number desired and purpose of importation.
- 3. Application to import is approved by the Research Coordinator (Entomology) of the Research Branch, Department of Agriculture.
- 4. If permit is issued, permittee is provided with special instructions and a mailing label to route the parcel through an Inspection Station.
- 5. If on inspection insects are found which are not specifically covered by the permit, the importation may be refused entry or destroyed.
