RESEARCH NOTE

Dr. R. W. Pease, Jr., 36 Lincoln Street, New Britain, Connecticut, 06052, reports that Scudder, in his Butterflies of the Eastern United States and Canada, had reported that Polygonia interrogationis hibernates in New England and reappears in May. Dr. Pease believes it does not hibernate in New England but migrates northward in the spring from more southerly winter quarters. He wants information on authentic New England hibernation, if any; and offers a bottle of scotch, or a gallon of ice cream, to the first person who sends him a genuine hibernating P. interrogationis from New England before April 1. He also wants information on early dates of appearance of migrating specimens, as well as reports of assemblages of other sp. of Polygonia at bait or tree sap.
