Dr. Pease believes it does not hibernate in New England but migrates northward in the spring from more southerly winter quarters. He wants information on authentic New England hibernation, if any; and offers a bottle of scotch, or a gallon of ice cream, to the first person who sends him a genuine hibernating P. interrogationis from New England before April 1.
