# NEWS NOTES

Roy Kendall reports that Mr. and Mrs. Paul Malzac, of France, spent two days collecting in Texas with the Kendalls in May with good results. Mr. and Mrs. Thos. R. Manley, Bloomsburg, Pa., are doing some research on Limenitis and other species; they and Mr. E. M. Kinch, Fort Worth, and the Kendalls collected in the Welder Wildlife Refuge at Sinton in June. Dr. J. W. Tilden and son, Bruce, did extensive collecting in Texas in June and July; Dr. John Burns spent a second summer at the University of Texas on electrophoresis investigations with Dr. F. M. Johnson. Dr. J. G. Franclemont, New York, visited Mr. A. Blanchard of Houston and collected extensively in June and July. Lucien Harris, Jr., of Georgia, will collect in Texas in September.

The Associated Press reports that Portland (Oregon) State College Professor Ralph Macy has pointed out that "when people inhabit an area they bring insecticides, weed killers and bulldozers with them. You can't have progress and a continuing healthful atmosphere for butterflies in the same area. The process of urbanization leaves no loopholes for butterflies." 
