

INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION ON ZOOLOGICAL NOMENCLATURE

1713. Type-species for *Prospaltella* Ashmead, 1904 (Insecta, Hymenoptera).
1716. Type-species for *Chamaemyia* Meigen, 1803 (Insecta, Diptera).
1720. Suppression of *Xyleborus* Bowdich, 1825 (Insecta, Coleoptera).

MOUCHA, J., & F. PROCHÁZKA: Beautiful Butterflies. 135 pp., 56 pls. London: Spring Books. 1963.

This book is an attractive introduction to the diurnal Lepidoptera for the layman. An interesting and informative discussion of the group is followed by a series of magnificent plates, representing some spectacular tropical species and some representative European forms, with remarks on their distribution, biology, and variation.
