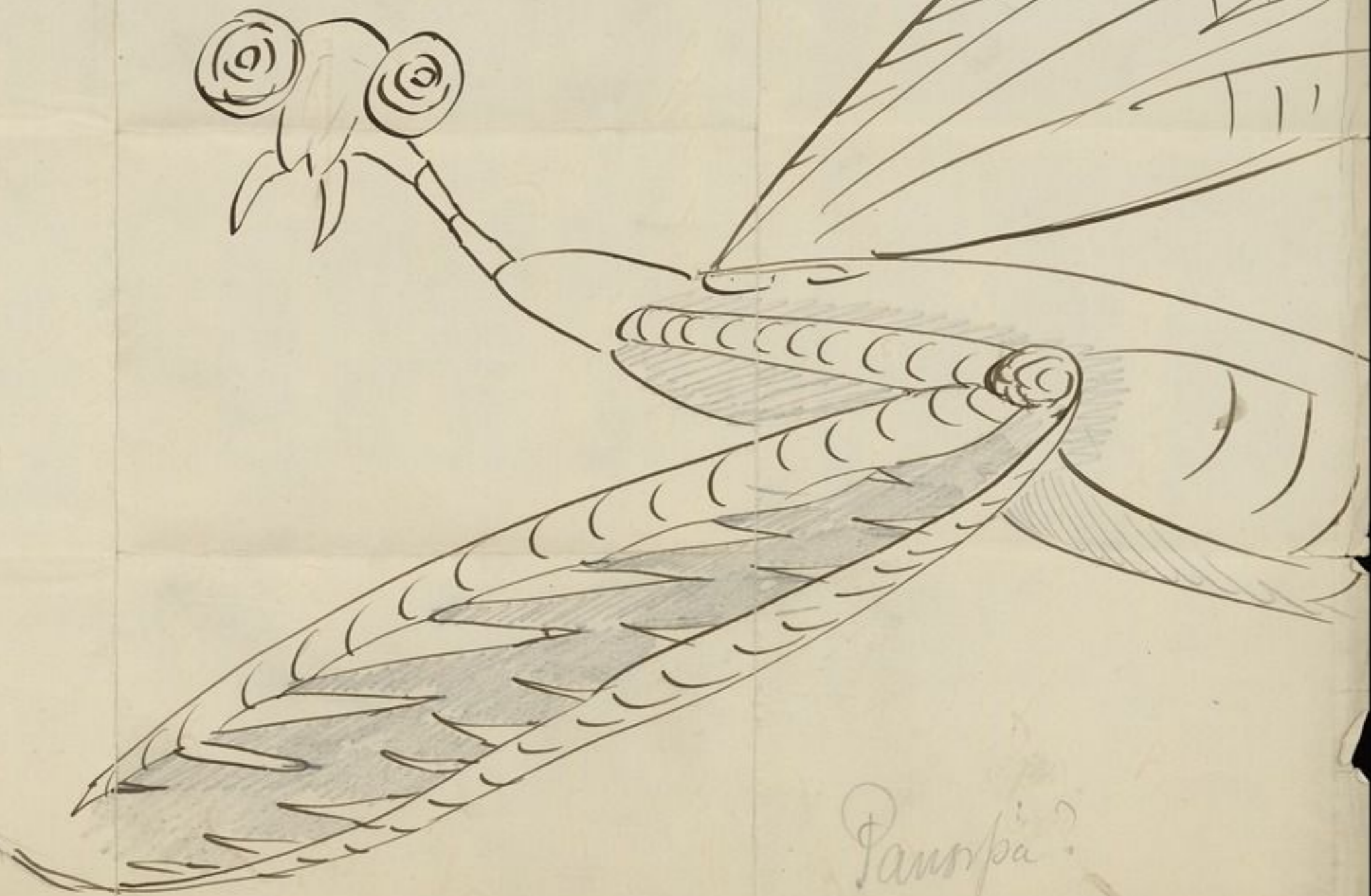
Dear Professor:
