Dear Prof. March

I hope to go to Nassau N. P. about March 1st with a party of scientific students, to establish there the marine laboratory of the University, and to spend about five months in research in marine geology.

As I have found that it is very necessary, in a British colony to be favorably brought to the notice of the officials. I wish to ask you if you will, as President of the National Acad., give me a letter of introduction to the Governor of the Bahamas Is., stating that our work is of general interest and value to science, and that I have for many years been engaged in similar work.

I shall ask our Secretary of State for a similar letter, and I should be glad if you would send me ^{also} a letter to ^{the Secretary} him, in a few words, who I am, and what our work will be in the Bahamas, and why it will be advantageous for us to have

an official introduction to the
authorities at Nassau. I will
forward this letter to our Secretary
of State when I apply to him for
a letter to the Gov. of the Bahamas Is.
