Six aboriginal, Stone & Pottery Pipes
Seven Stone pebbles for pounding Corn
Three Stone Tomahawks

A number of flint or obsidian implements
A portion of a soapstone Rattle.

Arrowheads in great variety.

Wampum, & a rare, net weaving
implement made of silicious slate.

The pipes are rare & exquisite one bearing
aztec features one Indian & one a Lizard carved

In addition I have a brass
plate and a brass tomahawk found
on the line of march of the
Indian & Tory band that burnt
Chung Valley, as they afterwards
did Wyoming in Pa.

Both are fine specimens
of primitive jewelry & worth
a great deal, in that view.

They are for sale by you
for purposes intended cheap —
