Dear Sir:

Your favor of the 23^d

is at hand
Judge Daninger authorized me
last summer to sell his collection
for Two Thousand Dollars, and I would
sell it for that price now, though I should
think that that was a very low price for it.
But you are a better judge of its worth
than I am and if you think it is too
much, and wish to make an offer I
will submit it to him. You will however
run the risk of losing it in the mean
time, as he writes me that he has sent a
list of the collection to Paris, Berlin & Vienna
and he may receive offers from some of
these places that will exceed yours.

He says that a smaller collection about
which he wrote me last year he has sold
to the University of Turin for more than he
offered it to Yale and to Beland Univy California
including freight to this country
