I am this morning favored with  
yours of the 23d inst, and also with the copy of the admirable  
Address by Professor Maule which you have been so good as  
to send me, and for which I cordially thank you. It will  
afford me pleasure to correspond with, and promote the best  
interests of, those charged with the conduct of the Museum,  
so far as my power extends. Most of my earlier publica-  
tions on the Antiquities of this State were utilized in the  
preparation of my Antiquities of the Southern Indians,  
particularly of the Georgia Tribes, D Appleton & Co. 1873.-  
One of my early tracts, - Monumental Remains of Georgia, -  
Savannah. 1841. I have the pleasure of sending you by  
this post. Subsequent reflection and enlarged experience  
have caused me to modify some of the views therein  
expressed. As most of the copies were destroyed during

the way, I send the accompanying rather as an  
auto bellum curiosity than otherwise.

I have recently prepared several articles, supplements  
 to my Antiquities of the Southern Indians &c, which  
 will probably soon appear under the auspices of the  
 Smithsonian Institution. It will afford us pleasure to for-  
 ward a copy, when printed.

I will be glad to have a copy of the Museum  
 report. Do you propose to institute a system of exchange  
 in the matter of archaeological objects?

Present, if you please, my compliments to  
 Professor Marsh, and my congratulations upon his  
 very exhaustive and most welcome address.
