Dear Prof. Marsh

I have been extremely
sorry, not to have
seen you when you passed
through Vienna. I believe
I might have shown you
several things of interest
for you. One of my stu-
dents has found a new lo-
cality ofcretaceous Rep-
tiles in Transylvanica
& we believe to possess
some more American
types here. I have called

Some of the best specimens
of Pelecy's paper, which you
saw at Vienna, to be co-
pied & can dispose of a
set of good casts of them.
The small jaw of *Mischlo-*
caurus was too delicate to
be copied. I would be hap-
py to be able to offer this
small set in exchange for
such casts, which might
be important for the his-
tory of the Transylvani-
an fossils. There is one
very remarkable skull
with several tightly ap-

proached rows of molars
in the upp. & lower ones
rows in the low. jaw, re-
minding of *Hadrosaurus*,
& other jaws like *Mischlo-*
don, *Iguanodon* or your
jinapris *Caeptosaurus*.
I know that you have gene-
rously disposed of your
treasures, but perhaps
you might have the kind-
ness to tell me, whether
a copy of the skull of
Caeptosaurus could be
had. I would also be
highly interested to pos-
sess casts of the Crania
figured by you on p. LXXVII.

for our University. I have
 shortly, induced by your
 important papers on the
 jurassic formation, pur-
 chased a copy from Da-
 kota from Krantz in Bonn.
